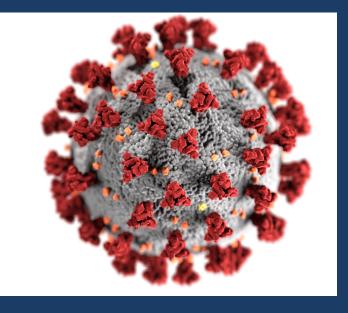
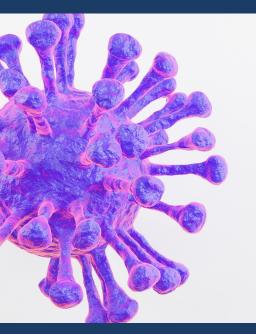
FACTS ABOUT THE COVID-19 DELTA VARIANT

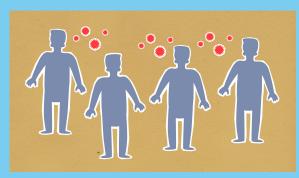
WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF DELTA VARIANT?
